

LEGISLATIVE TIMELINE





EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION: to provide funding for Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund

<u>ACT 394</u>

STUDENT ASSESSMENT: Relative to pupil progression, deletes requirements for summer remediation programs and requires that pupil progression plans be made publicly available



EARLY LITERACY : Requests the state Department of Education to create the Early Literacy Commission.



EARLY CHILDHOOD: Recreates the Early Childhood Care and Education Commission; Provides for termination of the commission on July 1, 2022

<u>ACT 206</u>

Relative to screening and intervention for students; to redefine the term dyslexia for purposes of testing and providing services to students with dyslexia

SPECIAL SESSION

The Center successfully advocates for \$2.2M Literacy Coach Pilot Program

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<u>ACT 415</u>

Relative to reading assistance for certain public school students; to establish the Steve Carter Literacy Program; to provide for student and service provider eligibility, program administration, payment amounts and uses, notifications, reports, and funding; and to provide for related matters.



<u>ACT 419</u>

Requires public school governing authorities and the state Dept. of Education to report certain data relative to students with dyslexia



<u>ACT 198</u>

Requires the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to coordinate and report data relative to early childhood care and education and to consider this data when allocating certain funding; also requires the creation of a program for providing instructional materials for home use



<u>ACT 400</u>

Authorizes the establishment of learning pods as extensions of public schools for the purpose of small group instruction; defines "learning pods" as a group of 10 students who receive instruction in a small group setting

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Created the position of Director of Evaluation and Data

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Literacy Coaching Program partners with LDOE to expand statewide - (\$2.2M)



<u>ACT 386</u>

Early Childhood: Provides for mandatory kindergarten attendance and requires compulsory school attendance beginning at age five.



ACT 108

EARLY LITERACY: All k-3 classroom teachers must be trained in science of reading

<u>ACT 438</u>

EARLY LITERACY: Requires all k-3 students to be assessed for literacy



<u>SR 133</u>

LITERACY: Requests the state Department of Education to recreate the Louisiana Early Literacy Commission to study and make recommendations relative to improving reading proficiency for certain students.

<u>ACT 607</u>

Adds dyslexia education to list of qualifications and requirements for teacher education programs



<u>ACT 133</u>

Re-creates the Department of Education for four more years. Changes termination date from July 1. 2023 to July 1, 2027

<u>ACT 448</u>

Requires passage of a reading instruction test as a condition of teacher certification in elementary education

<u>ACT 622</u>

Requires public school governing authorities, including those of charter schools, and the state Dept. of Education to report certain data relative to students with dyslexia



<u>ACT 627</u>

Relative to early childhood programs; to provide relative to the purpose for which a parish governing authority levies an additional tax to include preventative programs and specifies what preventative programs encompass

<u>ACT 395</u>

Creates a book delivery program for certain public school students; establishes the Reading Enrichment and Academic Deliverables Program to provide student eligibility, program administration and funding



<u>ACT 520</u>

Provides for additional literacy screenings for students in grades K-3, requires individual reading plans for certain students, and literacy coaches for teachers



<u>ACT 532</u>

Relative to prekindergarten instruction; to require each city, parish, and other public school board to work to implement a mixed provider delivery model for full-day prekindergarten instruction; and to provide for related matters



<u>ACT 82</u>

Relative to the Early Childhood Care and Education Commission; requires the task force to study and make recommendations relative to compensation issues within the early childhood care and education field to repeal the termination date of the commission; and to provide for related matters.



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
